The Department of Chemistry organized an **Orientation Programme** for the “**Young India – Life Science Skilling Program**” on **10th October 2024**, with the objective of highlighting the importance of becoming industry-ready and creating awareness about this major skilling initiative.

The resource person, **Mr. V. V. K. Rao**, addressed the **M.Sc. Organic Chemistry final-year students**, explaining the aims and benefits of the program. He emphasized that the broader objectives include:

- Providing certification as per World Economic Forum standards
- Offering opportunities for offline learning
- Imparting advanced skill development aligned with industry requirements
- Empowering top talent in the healthcare sector and fostering innovation

He also explained that to be part of this premier skilling initiative, launched through **C4IR Telangana** in collaboration with leading industry and academic partners, students must complete the following steps:

1. **Check eligibility**
2. **Take the qualification test**
3. **Make payment for enrollment**

A total of **15 M.Sc. Organic Chemistry final-year students** appeared for the assessment conducted in the presence of the speaker and two faculty invigilators.

Out of these, **eight students—Madhusa, Vaishnavi, Sai Chandra Vardhan, M. Sowmya, K. Shruthi, P. Abhilash, Krishna Chaithanya, and Uday—**cleared the **Talent Test Assessment** and advanced to the interview round.

From this group, **four students—**

Mogili Sowmya,

Karnala Shruthi, and

Pabboju Abhilash—

successfully cleared the interview round and are now eligible to take up **three months of training**, followed by a **six-month paid internship** with a partnered pharma company at their designated location.
