



Procedure:

Above chemicals number one to ten are mixed well in a plastic bucket with the help of a stick . then acid slurry is added slowly and mixed well with the help of gloves. The mixture become hot, after cooling the mixture it is filtered. 5-10 ml perfume and coloured granules are added. Finally detergent powder is packed in plastic covers.

Phenyl preparation:

In a plastic bucket pine oil and soft liquid are added and mixed well. In another bucket 2lts of water is taken and cutting oil is added slowly and with a stick. Milky white solution forms. This mixture is added to the above mixture slowly and mixed with a jug. Color& perfume are added. Formed phenyl is filled in bottled and it is used as dettol.

Water is taken to half portion of the 1lt vessel and heated. In another small vessel petroleum gel and wax are taken and kept in hot water vessel. After cooling color& perfume are added and filled in bottles. It is used in winter season.

Shampoo preparation:

Procedure:

Rita, shikakai, cumin seeds & coco D are soaked overnight in separate vessels. These soaked substances are heated on low flame and filtered.

In a vessel sodium lauryl sulphate is taken and the above filtrates are added to it and stirred well. Sodium Benzoate & color are added and heated for two minutes and cooled. Perfume is added and filled in bottles.

Precautions to be taken during the preparation:

1. Hand gloves and masks are compulsory
2. Only plastic utensils should be used
3. Hand should be without nails and washed immediately
4. Asthma patients, pregnant ladies, small kids should be far away from the chemicals

Impact:

In this workshop more than 120 students along with 25 lectures participated. They learned the technique of making of products and understand the importance of reducing the cost of each item by more than 50% from the market value. These products were manufactured and marketed by students to earn their livelihood- self generation scheme and workshop certificates were given to the staff and students.
